

2024 Hatchery Tour Terms & Conditions

Hello Group Leaders! Thank you for your interest in touring the Issaquah Salmon Hatchery. We are excited to have you come and learn about hatchery operations, salmon recovery, and watershed stewardship. To ensure a safe, educational experience for everyone, we ask that participants abide by the following terms and conditions.

1. Be Prepared.

Tours are mostly outdoors and happen rain or shine. They begin and end at the flagpole on the north side of the hatchery, and last for approximately one hour. Tours cover less than one mile on ADA accessible flat or gently sloped, gravel and paved surfaces.

Our tour guides can lead groups of up to 12 child participants with at least 1 adult chaperone. To expedite the start of tours, pre-arrange groups that contain a maximum of 12 child participants and at least 1 adult chaperone.

Before or after the tour, lunch may be eaten on hatchery grounds or at Gibson Park across the street. There are only two single-use public bathrooms at the hatchery, so consider taking bathroom breaks before and after your visit.

2. Be Safe.

The hatchery is a working facility with regular usage of heavy equipment and machinery. It is your responsibility to keep yourself and all other participants safe before, during, and after tours.

There must be at least 1 adult chaperone for every 12 child participants. Adult chaperones must always stay with their group, help keep everyone together, and prevent child participants from running and climbing on hatchery structures.

3. Have Fun.

Our volunteer tour guides are excited to share their knowledge. Help us set the tone of the tour with your own interest, attention and enthusiasm. Refrain from using phones unless to take pictures.
